

Atlantic Puffins

on an offshore island

The Atlantic Puffin is a bird of the sea, returning to offshore islands only during the nesting season. Its bill, spectacular in shape and color, is an essential tool on water and on land. When a puffin chases after fish, it can clamp down on prey one at time until its bill holds a dozen fish or more. On land, the puffin nests in a rock crevice or digs its own burrow. Biting and scraping into the soil with its powerful bill, the puffin can excavate a tunnel 3–6 feet long with a chamber at the end for a single egg.

A puffin's bill changes colors with the seasons. It's brightest during spring and summer when it's time to court a mate and raise young. After breeding, colorful sheaths on the bill drop off, leaving the puffin with a plainer bill as it goes back to sea, where it will spend the next eight months.
